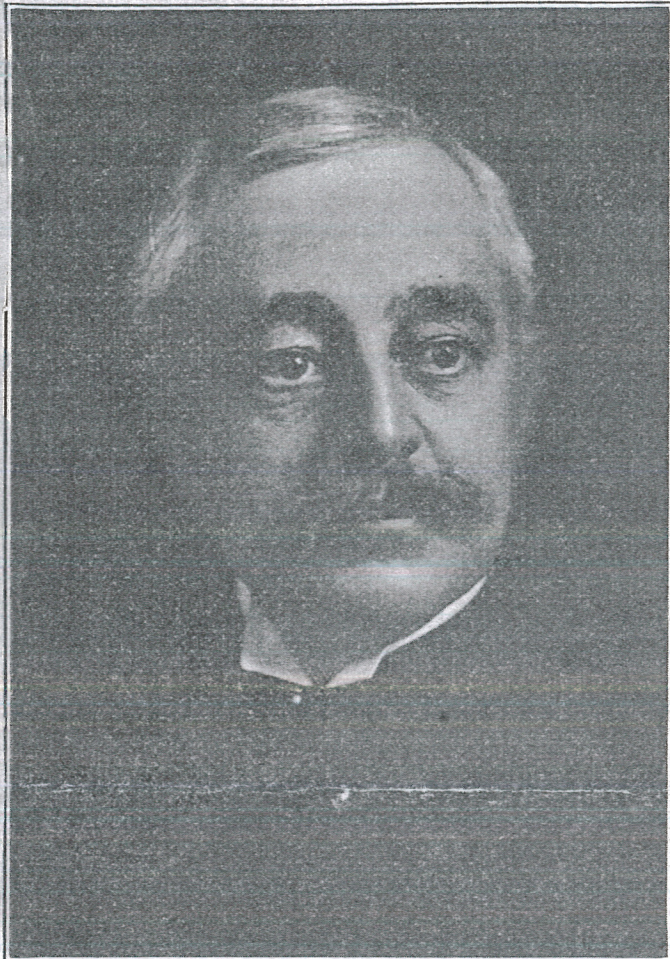

John C. Dilworth Dies After
Pgh. Post
Feb 23, 1924
Short Illness.



John C. Dilworth, member of an old and prominent Pittsburgh family, and an active member of the Chamber of Commerce, who was seen in the Chamber daily, died on Tuesday morning last at his residence 518 Roslyn Place.

Mr. Dilworth's death was due to pneumonia, which he had contracted five days before his death. He was born in Pittsburgh in 1860, the son of John Scott Dilworth and Mary Parry Dilworth. His family moved to Philadelphia for eight years when he was a boy, and he was educated there. He was twice married, his first wife being Miss Julia Creighton of Philadelphia. His second wife was Miss Elizabeth S. Gill of Meadville.

He was engaged in business with his son, Creighton Dilworth. Mr. Dilworth had long been prominent in Masonry, and was a past president of the Masonic Veteran Association. He was a member of Calvary Episcopal Church. He leaves his wife and two sons, Creighton and John Gill Dilworth.
